High-Risk Individuals

It is the policy of the Owen Sound Police Services Board with respect to high-risk individuals that the Chief of Police will:

- (a) Work in partnership, where possible, with the local Crown, appropriate community members and agencies, including health care providers, government agencies, municipal officials, other criminal justice agencies, including law enforcement agencies, as well as Victim Services to ensure a coordinated and effective strategy in response to high-risk individuals that addresses:
  - I. Bail opposition consistent with the Ministry's guidelines on bail and violent crime;
  - II. Dangerous offenders and long-term offender applications;
  - III. High-risk national offender flagging system and requirements of CPIC;
  - IV. Information sharing;
  - V. Case management planning;
  - VI. Judicial restraint orders;

	VII.	Victim assistance; and	
	VIII.	Disclosure of information, including planning.	community notification and safety
(b)	Ensure that the Police Service's skills development and learning plan address the training and sharing of information with officers, communication centre an supervisors on police response to high-risk individuals.
