## Report to the Board: Criminal Investigations Branch

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During February, 2019 Detectives in the Criminal Investigation Branch conducted investigations relating to Sexual assaults, Child Abuse, Domestic Violence, Sudden Death, Thefts, Wanted Persons and Drug offences. Some of the investigations that were concluded are outlined below.

On February 8<sup>th</sup> Detectives investigated a male who stole a watch from a downtown business. The male posted the watch for sale on the internet for several hundred dollars. Detectives contacted the accused posing as a potential purchaser, conducted surveillance and arrested the 35 year old Owen Sound man. The stolen watch was recovered by police and returned to the business owner. The man was also found in possession of Methamphetamine at the time of his arrest. The accused was charged with numerous offences and held in custody.

On February 8<sup>th</sup> Detectives assisted the Uniform Branch by locating and arresting two Domestic Violence offenders. Both of the males were found at their respective residences the day after the alleged offences took place.

On February 20<sup>th</sup>, Detectives conducted a Domestic Violence investigation involving a male offender who was associating with his past victim in violation of a court order. A warrant granting authorization for police to enter the dwelling of the victim was obtained as part of the investigation. The male offender was located hiding in a bedroom closet and was taken into custody. Detectives also arrested three additional males in the residence who were wanted on warrants and were not abiding by their respective court orders. All four males were held in custody pending court appearances.

On February 22<sup>nd</sup> Detectives attended Georgian College for a presentation on street gangs that was put on by the Toronto Police Service. A Toronto gang investigator presented on current trends and activities of street gangs and their members in both Toronto and the Province of Ontario.

One Detective attended a two week course on MCM/ Power Case.



## Report to the Board: Drug Enforcement

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The Drug and Intelligence Units continue to investigate persons involved in the trafficking of various dangerous drugs in Owen Sound. As in previous months, the focus continues to be on Fentanyl and Crystal Methamphetamine.

On February 11, surveillance observations conducted by the Drug Unit lead to multiple arrests of persons involved in the drug subculture. A 34 year old man was observed associating with a female whom he was prohibited from having any contact with. A warrant was also in effect for the man from the Huron County O.P.P. The man was taken into custody without incident.

Later on February 11, the Drug Unit observed a female leaving a City residence who was prohibited by court order from being in the City of Owen Sound with the exception of court proceedings. The female was also wanted on an arrest warrant out of Barrie, Ontario. The female was arrested and found to be in possession of a small quantity of suspected Fentanyl. The female accused was held in custody.

On February 14, a drug trafficking investigation was concluded with the arrest of a 48 year old Owen Sound man. The investigation determined that the man was involved in the trafficking of Crystal Methamphetamine. A total of 33 grams of Methamphetamine was found in a lock box being carried by the accused when police placed him under arrest. The accused also had a quantity of cash and drug packaging in his possession. The man was charged with possession for the purpose of trafficking and was held in custody. The street value of the seized drugs is as much as \$3,300.

In February one Detective attended a week long course on Outlaw Motorcycle Gang activities and investigations at the Ontario Fire College in Gravenhurst.

There were a total of **1390** bulk searches completed in February 2019.

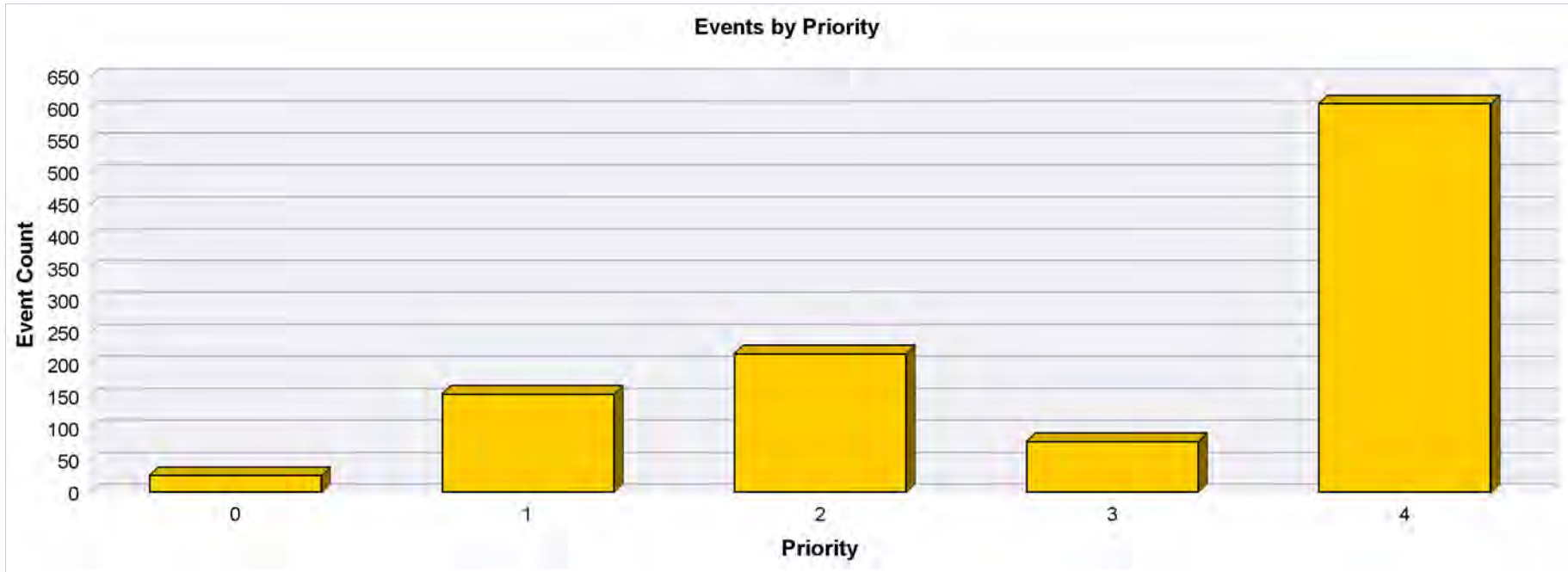

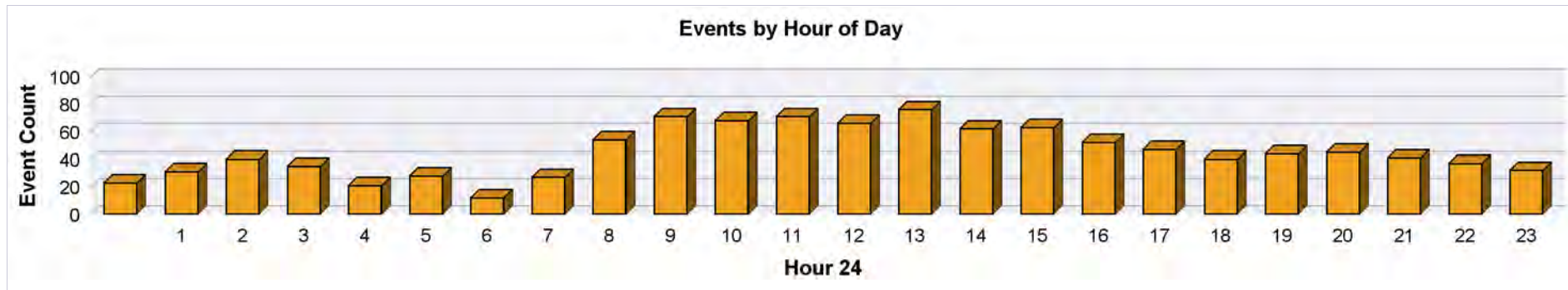
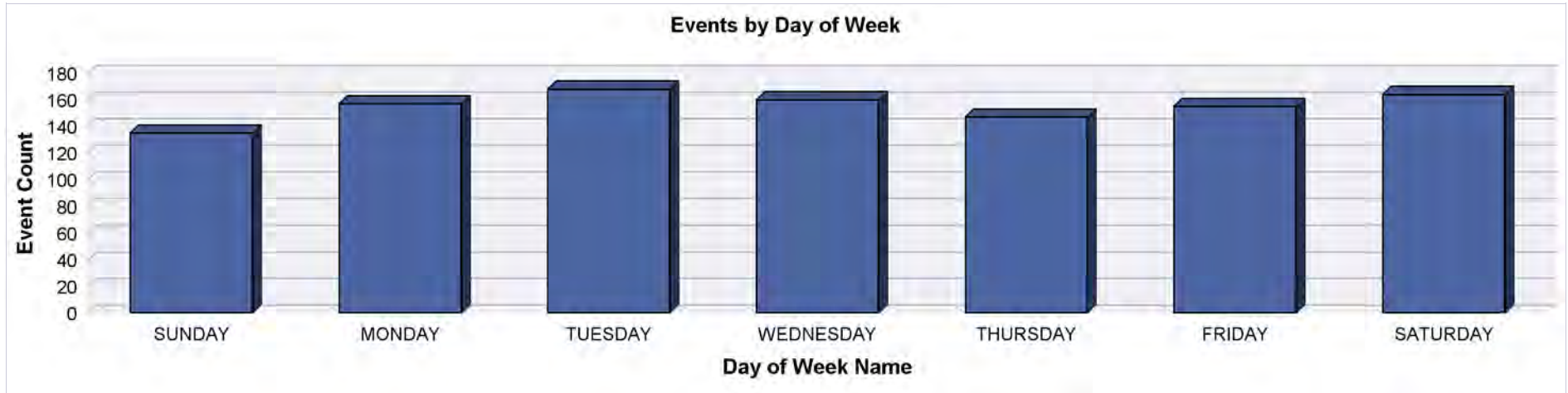

# Number of Events by Day of Week/Hour of Day - February 2019



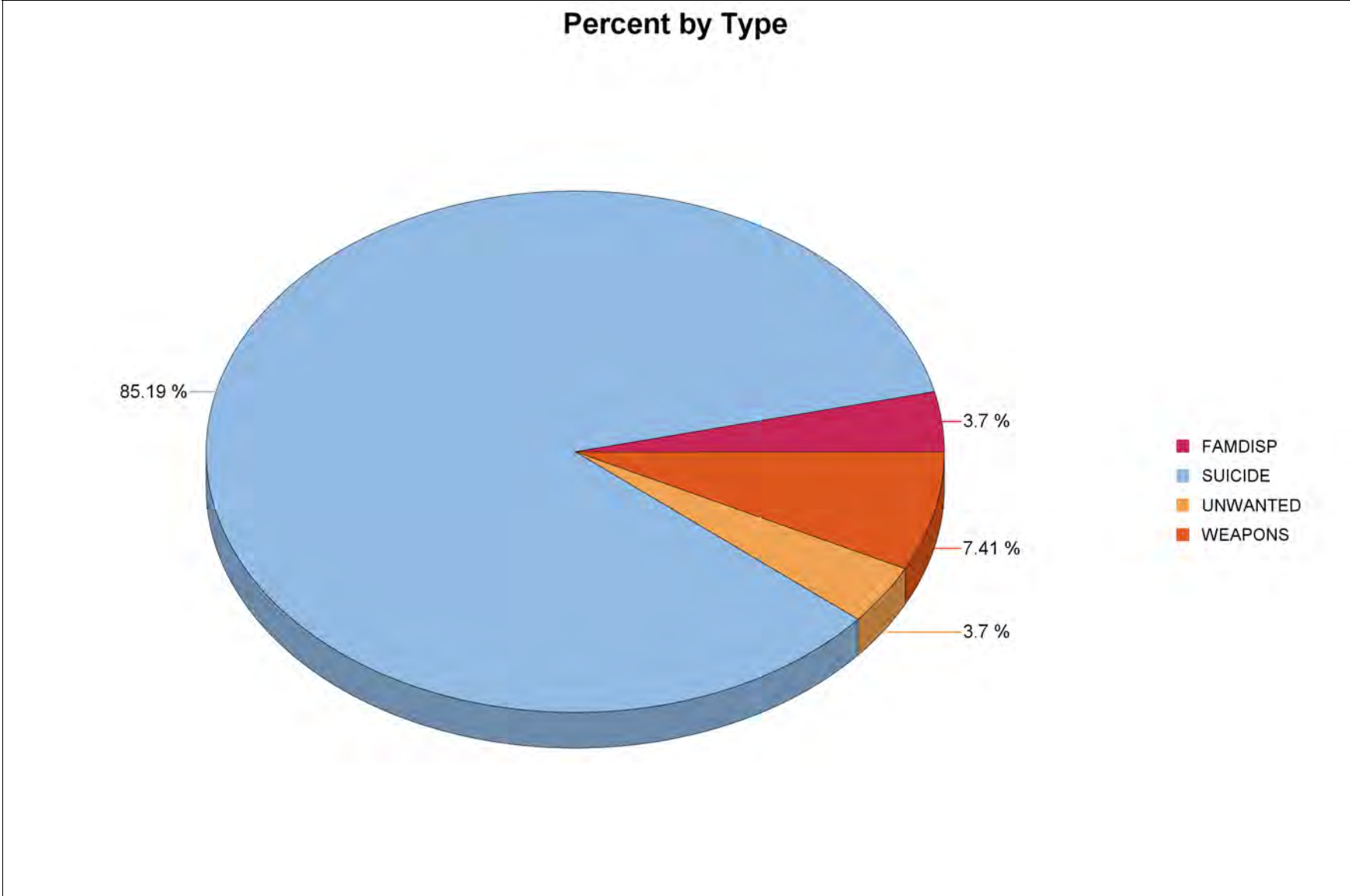

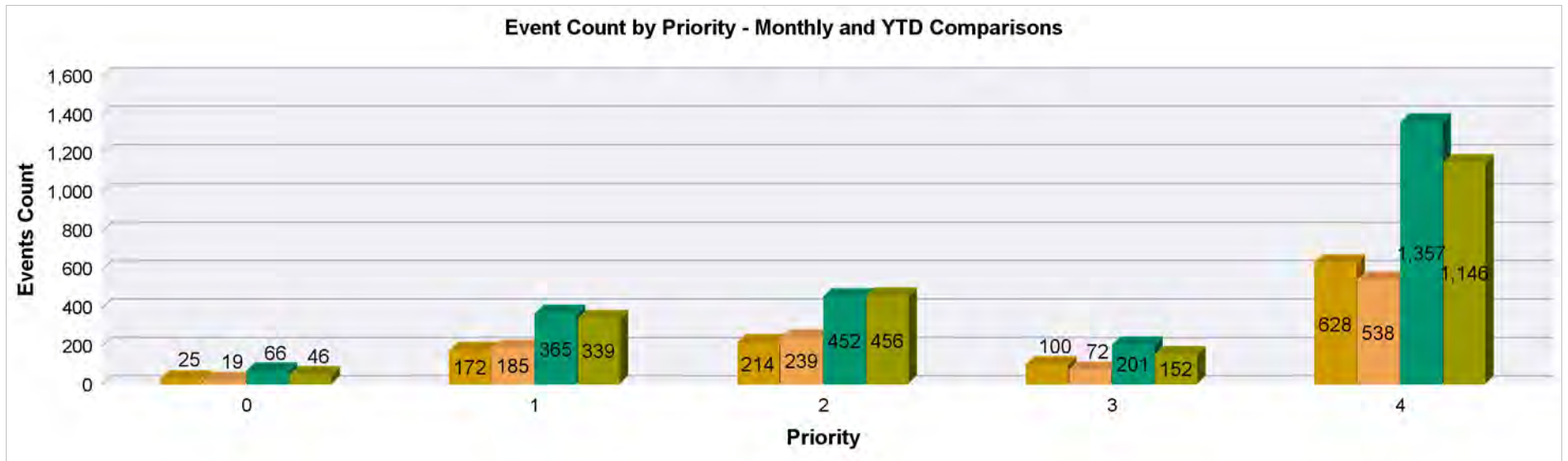
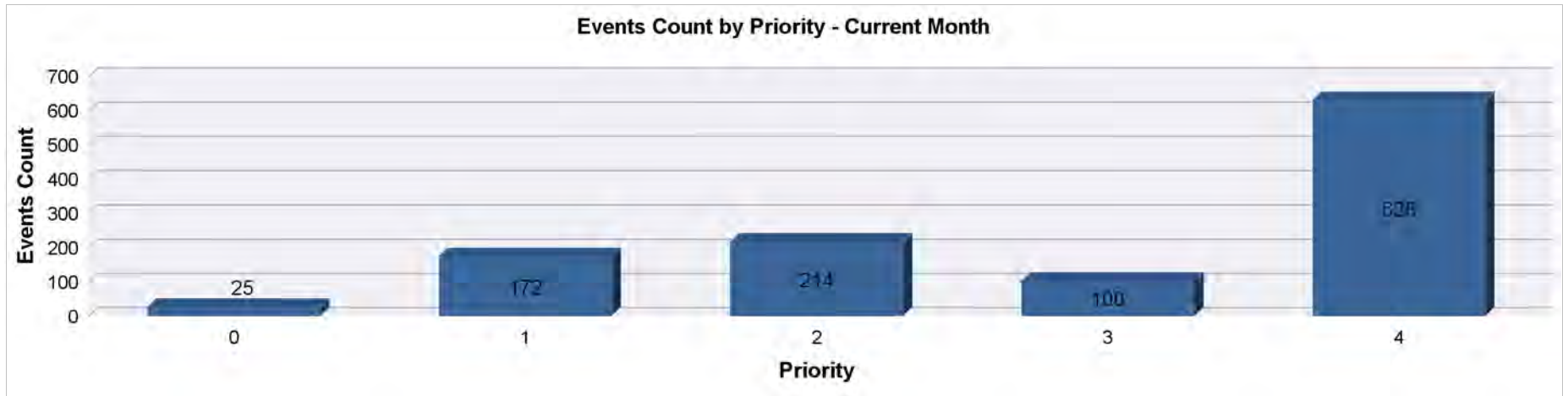

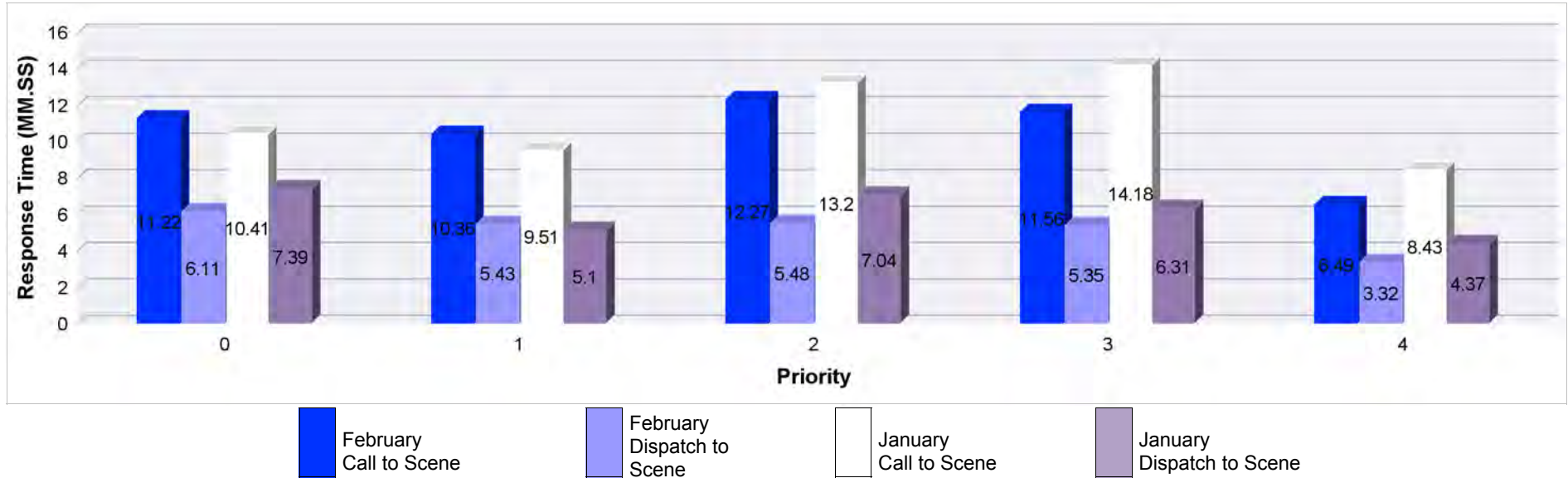

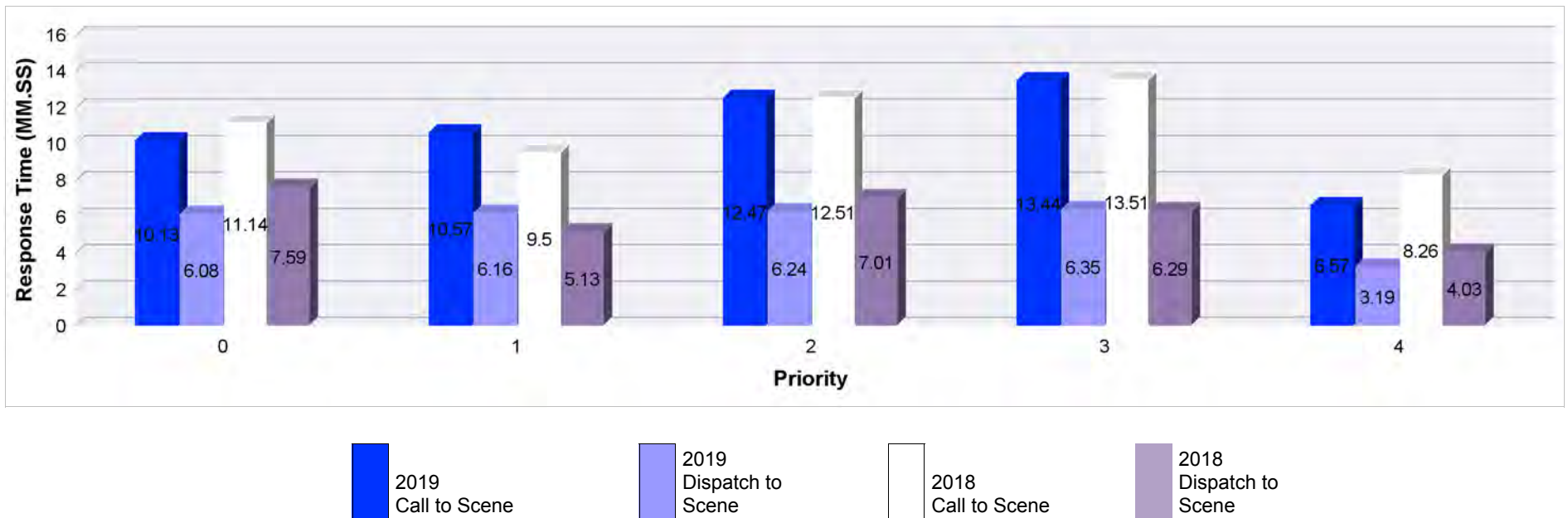
